The Seventh Commandment not only forbids stealing but also calls us to promote justice in economic life, including fair wages, ethical work, and responsible use of profit. How do we, as Christians, live out this call in a society that often prioritizes profit over people? In our own work, spending, or leadership roles, how can we ensure we're contributing to a more just and equitable world?

Love for the Poor

In Matthew 25, Jesus reminds us that how we treat the least among us is how we treat Him: 'I was hungry and you gave me food... In truth I tell you, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." How does this challenge us to think differently about our responsibility toward others – not just avoiding theft or injustice? What are some concrete ways we can live this out in our everyday lives?
